Project ADAM helps implement public access defibrillation programs (PAD) across Texas and the nation.

Our goal is to increase awareness of sudden cardiac death and establish emergency programs that provide a timely and lifesaving response. Since 2011, our Project ADAM program at Cook Children's has recognized 521 Heart Safe Schools and 18 Heart Safe School Districts.
