

AED donation to Prosper Multispecialty Clinic

Cook Children's Heart Center & Project ADAM teamed up to deliver 3 brand new Cardiac Science AEDs and cabinets to our newest facility, Prosper Multispecialty Clinic. Staff were trained how to use the AED by Project ADAM Coordinator, Sarah Thieroff. Dr. Lauren Acres, Steph Duran and her clinical staff are working with physicians to recruit an emergency response team for the crash cart AEDs. Members will consist of nurses, medical assistants and physicians at the multispecialty clinic. In addition, Project ADAM is engaged with the local school district and excited to work with them to help establish emergency response teams, emergency response plans and AED drills in all the Prosper ISD schools.



Heart Safe School activities during the pandemic

If you are able to work on cardiac emergency preparedness planning for your school, consider these ideas/resources:

- Review your school's emergency response plan. Don't have one? Click here for some examples.
- Check your cardiac emergency response team's CPR certifications and education. We recommend every member on the team be CPR certified, but as a minimum they must have annual Hands Only CPR/AED training with observed compression practice.

- Plan your AED drill(s): Click here for our Cardiac Emergency Response Drills document. AED drill videos can be found here and here. Consider doing your drill on a staff development day. Less people will be around which makes it easier to social distance and practice your emergency response. Download our editable AED Drill Checklist, print and fill it out during your drill, then type your text in the document and save to your computer for easy record keeping.
- Already a Heart Safe School in our program? Take a look at the annual requirements <u>here</u>. If you run into challenges getting any of these done by the December 31st banner sticker deadline, contact us and we'll work with you. The link to receive your banner sticker and complete our online annual Heart Safe School form is here.
- Online CPR instruction: <u>Click here to view these local</u> <u>Hands Only CPR & AED training videos</u>. School nurses, consider showing these videos over Zoom/sending them out to staff to watch independently, then have them come to your office for compression checkoff. It's a nice alternative to in-person training.
- Check out this helpful handout from American Heart Association on COVID-19 and adult CPR.
- Offer a virtual/in-person all staff awareness training. It can be as simple as using this all staff training script or asking your principal for 10-15 minutes at the next Zoom/inperson meeting to go over your school's emergency plan, emergency team, how to recognize and how to communicate an emergency.
- Watch this cute AED training video on YouTube.
- Become a Heart Safe School! Follow these steps to start the process:

Step 1: Go to www.projectadam.com/heartsafeschools

This website is full of amazing resources to prepare your school for designation. Follow the steps, submit your paperwork to

<u>ProjectAdamTexas@cookchildrens.org</u> and ensure your school is Heart Safe should an emergency arise.

Step 2: In collaboration with your school's administration, conduct a <u>Cardiac Emergency Preparedness Assessment</u> for your school and email it to <u>ProjectAdamTexas@cookchildrens.org</u>.

Step 3: After the assessment, turn any "Nos" to "Yeses" by following the steps in the <u>Heart Safe Toolkit.</u> We're here for any questions or assistance you might need.

Step 4: Practice your AED drill using this <u>Cardiac Emergency</u>

<u>Response Drills document</u> and <u>AED drill instructional video</u> to help you plan and execute your practice drill.

Once you've completed the steps and are ready for designation, email these forms to ProjectAdamTexas@cookchildrens.org:

Upon receipt of both checklists, we'll send you an email confirmation to request any additional information if necessary, confirm your school name, order your banner and schedule a time for your Heart Safe School recognition.
